32,153 guests visited the Museum – nearly an 8% increase over last year




2,722 guests celebrated in the museum during one of **63 museum rentals**, including baby showers, birthday parties, and business gatherings

Children's Programming

FY2024-2025 Highlights

Stories were our spark this year: little ones listened, built, danced, and discovered their own voices while connecting with community history, nature, and culture. Across weekly drop-ins, school-day adventures, and big, joy-filled celebrations, we invited families to make memories—and to carry these stories forward. Here, we share a few highlights.

KIDS' COUNTDOWN TO NYE (DECEMBER 31)

We rang in "midnight" at noon with music, movement, hats, face painting, and a balloon drop—our biggest family party of the year.

HUB MODEL RAILROAD (JANUARY 18-20)

Regional model railroaders filled Burnham Hall with intricate layouts including a beloved Thomas & Friends Sodor scene—for deep, imaginative play.

HARRY POTTER PARTY (NOVEMBER 2)

A museum-wide wizarding takeover featured a sold-out magic show, potion labs, crafts, photo op, and a sock drive honoring Dobby—high-impact, missionaligned fun with a service twist.



DINO DANCE BBQ MEMBER EVENT (MARCH 28)

Members boogied at a dino dance party, excavated eggs, and crafted together—strengthening community and loyalty.

Children's Programming

SPRING INTO NATURE FESTIVAL (JUNE 7)

Families and community partners celebrated the season with hands-on crafts, garden activities, and insights from local experts on beekeeping and Victory Gardens. In partnership with the HW Garden Club, the festival invited all to learn, play, and connect with nature, and strengthened community ties.

MORNINGS AT THE MUSEUM (ONGOING)

This new drop-in series for children ages 0–5 quickly became a favorite for families, offering a joyful, enriching way to start the day with themes around Arts & Making, Movement & Music, and Language & Literacy. Free with admission, Mornings at the Museum makes early learning accessible and welcoming for all.





Together, these programs turned stories into touchable, buildable, sing-along experiences—connecting generations through play, history, and imagination.

Adult Programming

Brown Bag Lunch Program

Stories come alive not only through artifacts and exhibitions, but also through conversations that connect past and present. The Wenham Museum's adult programming, including the Brown Bag Lunch Series, created opportunities for adults to gather, learn, and share stories. This free monthly program featured speakers on local history, culture, and contemporary issues, ensuring stories are preserved and passed on to future generations.




Financial Report

FY2024-2025

Behind every exhibition, program, and gathering at the Wenham Museum are the resources that make these stories possible. Our financial stewardship ensures that the stories of the past are preserved and that new stories continue to be shared with future generations. Through careful management of our resources, the Museum balances the needs of today with the promise of tomorrow. The following charts illustrate our operating revenue and expenses for FY24–25, reflecting the broad community support and thoughtful investments that sustain our mission.


TOTAL OPERATING INCOME

FNDOWMENT

The Museum maintains a diversified investment portfolio to help ensure long-term sustainability. Our investments are managed in accordance with board-approved policies, with an emphasis on preserving capital, generating steady income, and supporting the Museum's mission. This year, our portfolio experienced stable growth, providing resources that strengthen operations and future initiatives.

The Museum holds two endowment funds through Charles Schwab — including the Loring Endowment and the Board-restricted Endowment fund — with a combined fair value of \$1,031,647, generating distributions for FY26 of \$33,822 under a 4% spending policy. In addition, the Museum maintains a Reserve Fund, which began the fiscal year with a balance of \$60,000. To meet operating needs in FY24-25, a portion of this fund was utilized, leaving an ending balance of \$3,000.
